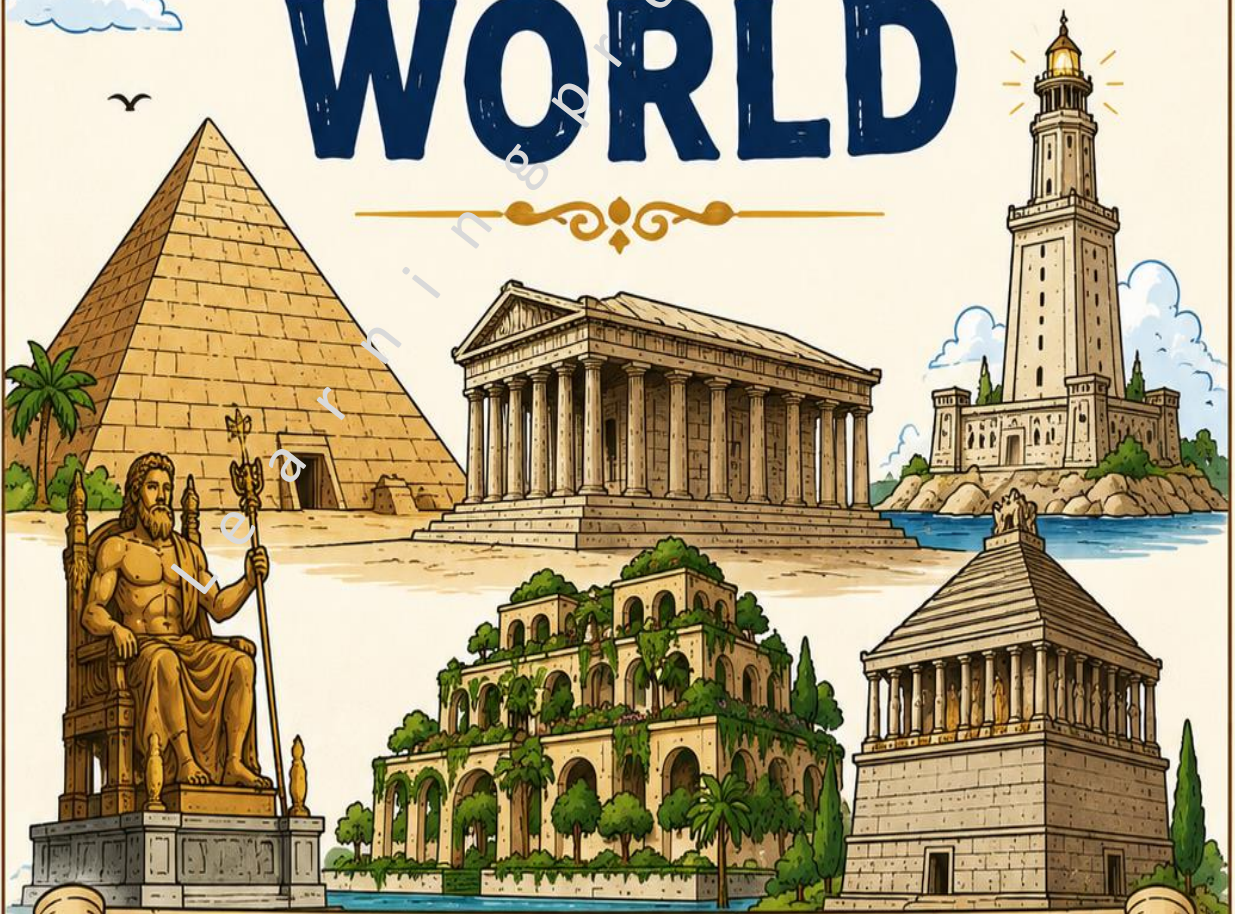

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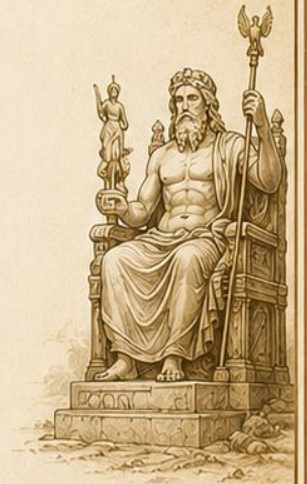

FACT SHEET



GREAT PYRAMID

--- A WONDER OF THE ANCIENT WORLD ---

The Great Pyramid of Giza is the largest and oldest of the three pyramids at Giza. It is the only one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World that still exists today!



QUICK FACTS

**LOCATION:**

Giza Plateau, Egypt

**BUILT AROUND:**

2560 BC

**BUILT FOR:**

Pharaoh Khufu (Cheops)

**TYPE:**

Tomb (Built as a resting place for the pharaoh)

**HEIGHT:**

Originally 146.6 meters (481 feet)
Today about 138.8 meters (455 feet)

**MATERIAL:**

About 2.3 million stone blocks (mostly limestone)

AMAZING FACTS

- ★ It took about 20 years to build.
- ★ It is one of the most precise structures ever built in the ancient world.
- ★ The sides of the pyramid are almost perfectly aligned to the four directions (North, South, East, West).
- ★ Each side of the base is about 230.4 meters (755 feet) long.
- ★ The stones were cut and placed with amazing accuracy.
- ★ It has survived for over 4,500 years!



INSIDE THE PYRAMID

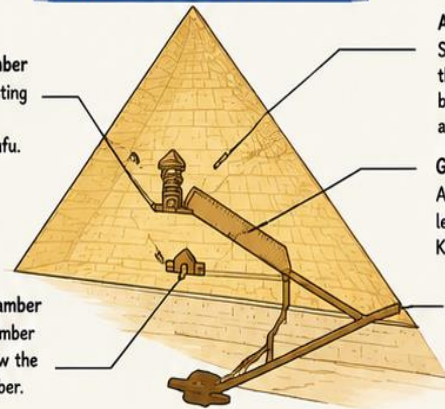
King's Chamber
The final resting place of Pharaoh Khufu.

Queen's Chamber
Another chamber located below the King's Chamber.

Air Shafts
Small shafts that may have been used for air or stars.

Grand Gallery
A long passage leading to the King's Chamber.

Entrance
The main entrance to the pyramid.

The Great Pyramid shows the incredible skills, knowledge and hard work of the ancient Egyptians. It is a symbol of their advanced engineering and strong beliefs about life after death.

600 BCE (approx.)

King Nebuchadnezzar II
for his wife, Amytis



TYPE:

A terraced garden with many
trees and plants



SIZE:

No exact measurements,
but it was said to be huge
and very impressive



MATERIALS:

Stone, bricks, lead pipes,
bitumen (natural waterproofing)

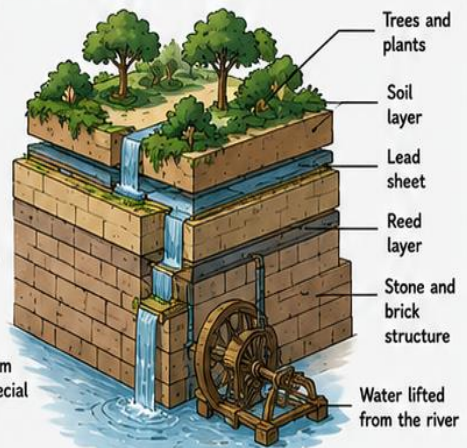
AMAZING FACTS

- The Hanging Gardens were not "hanging" in the air. They were built on terraces, one above another.
- They had many kinds of trees, flowers, shrubs and vines.
- A clever system of pumps and buckets lifted water from the river to water the plants.
- They were built to remind Queen Amytis of the green mountains of her homeland.
- There are no ruins of the Hanging Gardens today. Their exact location is still unknown!



HOW WERE THEY BUILT?

- Terraces were built one above another using strong stone and brick.
- A layer of reeds, then lead sheets, were used to prevent leaks.
- A thick layer of soil was added where trees and plants could grow.
- Water was lifted from the river using a special system and flowed through channels to water the gardens.



WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

The Hanging Gardens show the amazing creativity and engineering skills of ancient people. They are a symbol of love, nature and human imagination.

The Hanging Gardens of Babylon remind us that when people care for nature, they can create beauty that lasts forever in our stories and imagination.





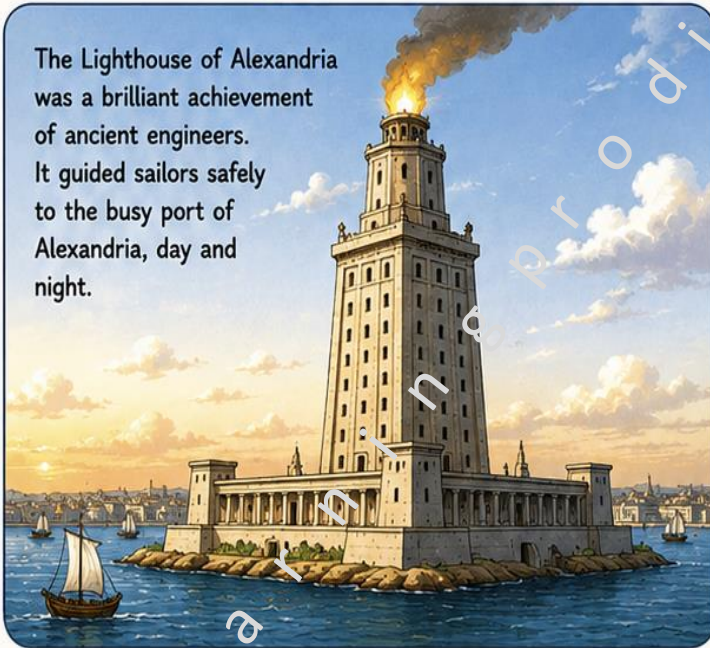

LIGHTHOUSE OF ALEXANDRIA



A WONDER OF THE ANCIENT WORLD

The Lighthouse of Alexandria was a brilliant achievement of ancient engineers. It guided sailors safely to the busy port of Alexandria, day and night.



QUICK FACTS



LOCATION:
Alexandria, Egypt



BUILT AROUND:
280–247 BC



BUILT BY:
Ptolemy I Soter (Pharaoh of Egypt)



TYPE:
Lighthouse (tall tower with a light to guide ships)



HEIGHT:
Estimated 100–140 meters (330–460 feet) tall – one of the tallest structures of the ancient world!



MATERIALS:
Stone blocks, marble, and lead

AMAZING FACTS

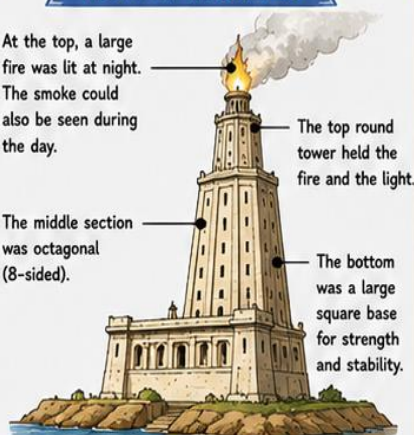
- ★ It was one of the tallest man-made structures for many centuries.
- ★ A bright fire burned at the top every night to guide ships.
- ★ Polished metal mirrors may have been used to reflect sunlight during the day.
- ★ It had three main levels: a square base, an octagonal middle, and a round tower at the top.
- ★ It stood for over 1,600 years!



HOW IT WORKED

At the top, a large fire was lit at night. The smoke could also be seen during the day.

The middle section was octagonal (8-sided).



Its light helped sailors find the safe harbor of Alexandria, even from far away.

DID YOU KNOW?



The Lighthouse of Alexandria was one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World.



It helped make Alexandria one of the most important ports and trading cities of the ancient world.



It was damaged by earthquakes over time and finally disappeared in the 14th century.



Pieces of the lighthouse were used in other buildings that still stand today!



The Lighthouse of Alexandria shows the incredible skill, innovation and vision of the ancient world.
A shining symbol of knowledge, guidance and hope!



COLOSSUS OF RHODES

— A MARVEL OF THE ANCIENT WORLD —

The Colossus of Rhodes was a gigantic statue of the Greek sun god Helios, built to honor the people of Rhodes and to celebrate their victory over the ruler of Cyprus in 305 BCE. It stood as a symbol of pride, strength and freedom.

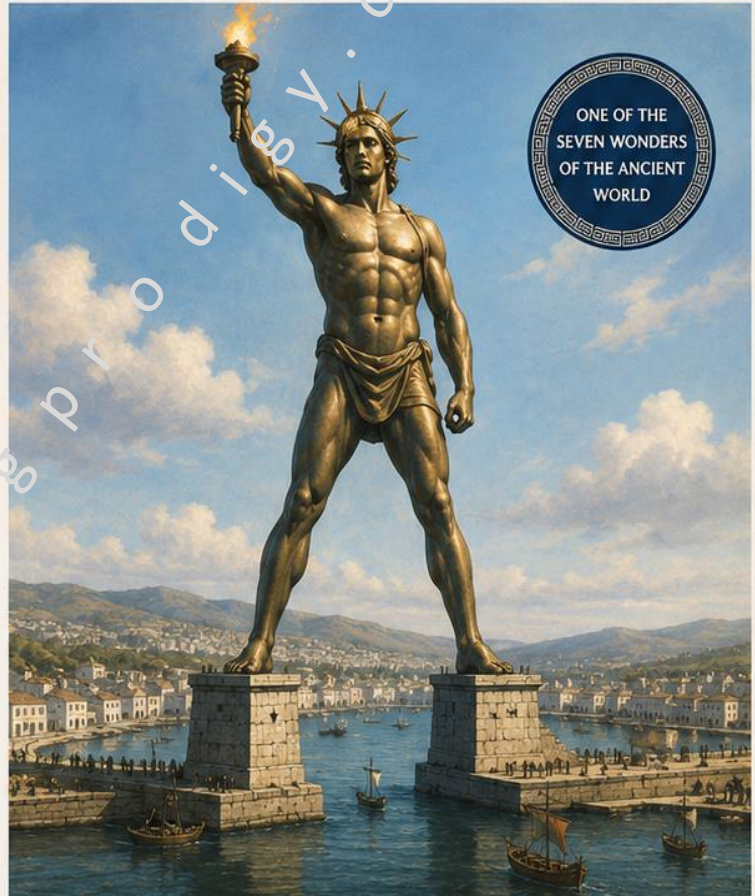

To honor Helios, god of the sun, and to celebrate a military victory

HISTORY

After a long siege, the people of Rhodes successfully defended their city against Demetrius I Poliorcetes of Cyprus in 305 BCE. To celebrate their victory and express gratitude to Helios, they built the Colossus using the spoils of war.



EARTHQUAKE & FALL

In 226 BCE, a powerful earthquake struck Rhodes. The Colossus broke at the knees and collapsed to the ground. It remained in pieces for about 800 years, admired by visitors from all over the world.



FATE

Around 654 CE, the Arab conqueror Muawiyah took control of Rhodes and sold the bronze remains of the statue. The metal was melted down and transported away, marking the end of this ancient wonder.

STATUE OF ZEUS

• KING OF THE GODS •

The Statue of Zeus at Olympia was one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. Created by the great Greek sculptor Phidias in the 5th century BCE, it honored Zeus, ruler of Mount Olympus and protector of the ancient Olympic Games.

c. 435–425 BCE

About 12–13 meters (39–43 feet)



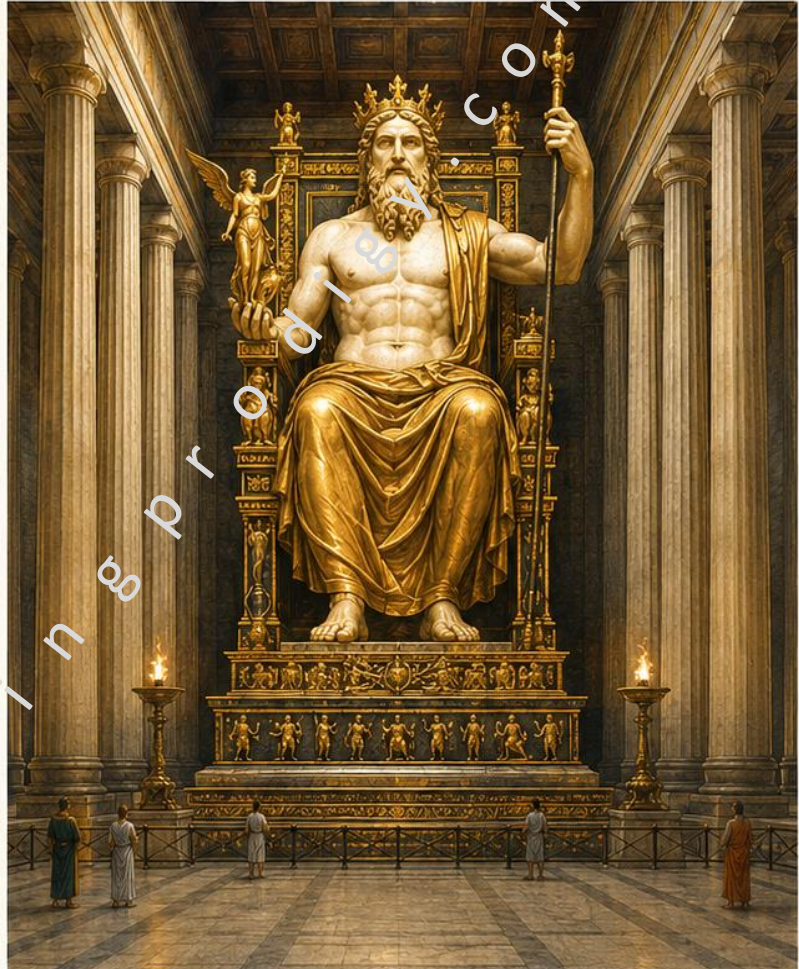
MATERIALS:
Wooden core covered with ivory and gold; throne made of wood, ivory, ebony and precious metals



SCULPTOR:
Phidias



PURPOSE:
To honor Zeus and symbolize his power and patronage of the Olympic Games



DESCRIPTION

Zeus is shown seated on a magnificent throne, holding a statue of Nike (victory) in his right hand and a scepter in his left. The statue's ivory skin and golden robes gleamed in the light, creating a breathtaking sight for all who entered the temple.



HISTORICAL CONTEXT

Olympia was a major religious center in ancient Greece. The statue stood in the Temple of Zeus, where athletes and pilgrims came to honor the god and celebrate the Olympic Games held every four years.



FATE

The statue survived for centuries but was likely taken to Constantinople in the 4th century CE and destroyed in a fire. No ancient copies survive; we know its appearance from ancient writings and coins.

Location: Giza, Egypt

Built as a tomb for Pharaoh Khufu, it is the oldest and the only wonder still standing.

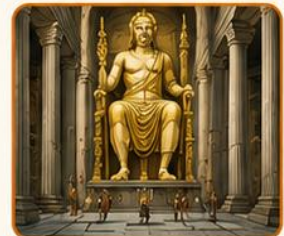

Seven extraordinary monuments built by ancient civilizations.
A legacy of human creativity, skill and ambition!

1 THE GREAT PYRAMID OF GIZA

Giza, Egypt



- Built around 2580–2560 BCE for Pharaoh Khufu.
- The only Wonder still standing today.
- Originally 146.6 meters (481 ft) high.

2 THE HANGING GARDENS OF BABYLON

Babylon, Iraq (ancient)



- Built around 600 BCE by King Nebuchadnezzar II.
- Famous for its lush greenery and advanced irrigation.
- It is not certain if it truly existed!

3 THE STATUE OF ZEUS AT OLYMPIA

Olympia, Greece



- Created by sculptor Phidias around 435 BCE.
- About 12 meters (40 ft) tall, made of ivory and gold.
- Housed in the Temple of Zeus.

4 THE TEMPLE OF ARTEMIS AT EPHEBUS

Ephesus, Turkey (ancient)



- Built around 550 BCE and dedicated to the goddess Artemis.
- Once a grand temple with 127 marble columns.
- Destroyed and rebuilt several times over the centuries.

5 THE MAUSOLEUM AT HALICARNASSUS

Halicarnassus, Turkey (ancient)



- Built around 350 BCE for King Mausolus.
- The word "mausoleum" comes from its name!
- Decorated with intricate sculptures and reliefs.

6 THE COLOSSUS OF RHODES

Rhodes, Greece



- Built around 292–280 BCE.
- A giant bronze statue of the sun god Helios.
- Stood over 30 meters (100 ft) tall at the harbor entrance.

7 THE LIGHTHOUSE OF ALEXANDRIA

Alexandria, Egypt



- Built around 280–247 BCE.
- One of the tallest man-made structures for centuries.
- Guided ships safely to the harbor with its light.

- ★ These wonders were known to ancient travelers and writers.
- ★ They showcase the incredible engineering and creativity of ancient civilizations.
- ★ Most of these wonders were destroyed by earthquakes, fires, or time.
- ★ The Great Pyramid of Giza is the only one that still exists today!
